

Safari via desktop or IPad

- 1. Open the safari app as usual
- 2. From the safari menu select preferences
- 3. Click the 'Autofill' tab
- 4. Choose 'edit' next to the type of web form autofill details you wish to change or update usernames and passwords



- 5. Once updated click done and close out of 'preferences' for the change to take effect
- 6. This is also where you would go to remove stored logins that you no longer want to be maintained by autofill. Just choose 'remove'




Safari on IPhone

- 1. Go to Settings > Accounts & Passwords > App & Website Passwords.
- 2. Your Touch ID or Face ID will be requested.
- 3. You will be presented with a list of all the services you have passwords for, listed by domain (website).
- 4. Scroll through the list until you identify the service you are looking for.
- 5. Tap on it and you will see your password on the next screen.
- 6. If you want to delete a password from the list, tap on it, choose Edit, and tap on the beside it.

Google Chrome

View, edit or delete saved passwords

- 1. On your computer, open Chrome.
- 2. Click on the circular profile icon on the right of the screen and click on the 'Key' icon



- 3. Locate your password for 'myclub.co.uk' within the list of saved passwords. Alternatively, you can type 'myclub.co.uk' into the search bar to see only saved passwords for 'myclub.co.uk'.
- 4. Locate the result that displays your membership number in the username column and:
 - To see the saved password, click on the eye icon to the right of the password. If you
 lock your computer with a password, you will be prompted to supply that before
 Chrome will display you the saved website password
 - To edit the saved password, follow the steps in the point above. You can edit the password once it is displayed. Simply click outside of the password field to save the changes
 - To delete the saved password, click on the three vertical dots to the right of the password and select 'Remove'
- 5. To clear all your saved passwords, clear browsing data and select "Passwords."

Microsoft Edge

You can delete the saved passwords in the browser:


- 1. Open Microsoft Edge and click the three dots in the top right corner.
- 2. Click on Settings.
- 3. Scroll down and click on View advanced settings.
- 4. Scroll down to Autofill settings and click on Manage passwords.
- 5. Choose the login you want to delete and click on the x next to it. It's gone!
- 6. view advanced settings edge

To edit the passwords saved on Edge, you must go through the browser:


- 1. Open Microsoft Edge and click the three dots in the top right corner.
- 2. Click on Settings.
- 3. Scroll down and click on View advanced settings.
- 4. Scroll down to Autofill settings and click on Manage passwords
- 5. Click on the logins you want to change; you can type in the new password in the box

Internet Explorer


- 1) Open your browser and choose tools from the top bar
- 2) Internet Options (at the bottom of the dropdown) then Content
- 3) Then select settings from the Autocomplete section



4) Manage Passwords




- 5) This will open another window (Control Panel>All Control Panel Items>Credential Manager)
- 6) With a list of websites that you have stored passwords for
- 7) Click the dropdown arrow against each one to view or remove passwords



Firefox


1) Select 'Options' from the menu



2) Security, then 'saved passwords'



- 3) You will see a list of websites on the right and passwords on the left (if you select 'show password')
- 4) If you want to remove a password, select the line and click remove



Samsung Internet (tablet, android etc.)

- 1. Select the three lines at the bottom left
- 2. Then settings > privacy and security
- 3. Choose 'Usernames and passwords' below will be a list of your saved sign in info
- 1) To switch off auto fill: use the slider at the top of the page to turn it on or off
- 2) To edit auto fill: tap on the entry first, then amend it
- 3) To delete an auto fill entry: tap on the entry first, then tap the bin icon at the top of the screen

Amazon Silk (kindle, tablet etc.)

- 1. Once in the browser click on the three lines in the top left
- 2. Select settings
- 3. Tap 'Save passwords' once this will take you to a list of all passwords already saved
- 4. To stop future saves toggle it off (this won't delete already stored passwords)
- 5. To delete some of your saved passwords, tap on the corresponding website address (note that the username for which the password is stored is shown below the site's URL). And in the next screen, tap on the Delete button at the bottom.

Opera

- 1. Go to Settings.
- 2. Click Advanced in the left sidebar, and click Privacy & security.
- 3. Under Passwords and forms, click Autofill settings.
- 4. Turn on Autofill forms.
- 5. To add an address or credit card for Opera to use when automatically filling in forms, click the **Add** button.
- 6. Your contact or credit card information can later be edited or removed. Click the menu next to the item you wish to edit or remove.
