



CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

FORMAT: A 36-hole stroke play competition played over two days.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 18.4
2. The Club Championship trophy will be awarded to the lowest 36-hole gross score. A prize will be awarded to the lowest 36-hole net score.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£10.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. First day to be played on the Coronation Course and second day on the Old Course. White tees.
5. Day one will be played in ascending handicap index order with the lowest handicap index going out first.
6. Day two will be played in descending gross score order with the lowest gross score going out last.
7. Top 30 Gross and Top 30 Net scores and ties after day one will progress into day two.
8. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95per cent of their **Course Handicap**.
9. All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
10. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate fee at the weekend.
11. Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.
12. It is every player's responsibility to play off their correct handicap. Playing off an incorrect handicap could result in disqualification.
13. Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No caddies allowed.
14. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
15. In the event of a tie after day two then the Club Championship will be decided by a sudden death play-off on the 18th hole. If required, this will be repeated twice more. In the event that there is still no winner then the players will use the 17th again repeating this twice more if needed followed by the 18th. Buggies with a driver will be allowed for the play-off without the production of a medical certificate. Drivers must not accompany players onto the greens at any point.
16. In the event of a tie for the net prize the winner will be determined by the best net score on day two, then over the back 9 holes, back 6, back 3, and finally the 18th hole of day two. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
17. If play is suspended due to bad weather on either the Saturday or the Sunday (i.e. one day only) and cannot be resumed, then the results from the day that has been completed will decide the winner. If play is suspended on both days of the competition (i.e. both Saturday and Sunday), then the competition will be declared null and void. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: will be awarded.



SENIORS' CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

FORMAT: An 18-hole stroke play competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to male golf pass holders aged 60 years and above on the day of the competition and with a handicap index up to 18.4.
2. The Seniors Club Championship will be awarded to the lowest gross score. A prize will be awarded to the lowest net score.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. The competition will be played on the Old Course from the yellow tees.
5. Tee times will be in descending handicap index order with the lowest handicap index going out last.
6. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95per cent of their **Course Handicap**.
7. All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
8. Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.
9. It is every player's responsibility to play off their correct handicap. Playing off an incorrect handicap could result in disqualification.
10. Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No caddies allowed.
11. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
12. In the event of a tie, the Seniors Club Championship will be decided by a sudden death play-off on the 18th hole. If required, this will be repeated twice more. In the event that there is still no winner then the players will use the 17th again repeating this twice more if needed followed by the 18th. Buggies with a driver will be allowed for the play-off without the production of a medical certificate. Drivers must not accompany players onto the greens at any point.
13. In the event of a tie for the net prize the winner will be determined by the best net score on day two, then over the back 9 holes, back 6, back 3, and finally the 18th hole of day two. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
14. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed, then the competition will be declared null and void. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: will be awarded.



SPRING AND AUTUMN MEETINGS

FORMAT: Each meeting is played over two days; both are an 18-hole handicap stableford competition on day one and an 18-hole handicap stroke play competition on day two.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. These two Meetings incorporate the **Hedges Butler Shield, Spring Meeting Medal, the Autumn Medal, the Hele Shaw trophy, the Scratch Gold Medal, the Dotteridge Memorial Trophy, the Coronation Challenge Putting Competition, and are the qualifying events for the Seligman Cup and Alfred Craven Memorial Trophy Knockout Competition.**
2. Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 18.4
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£6.00 per day) will be charged to members accounts.
4. In each Meeting, day one will be played on the Coronation Course and day two will be played on the Old Course. White tees.
5. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95per cent of their **Course Handicap** in both the stableford and stroke play competitions.
6. All pass holders must have three club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Passholders who do not qualify using the above criteria, may still play in the events but they will not be charged the applicable entry fee and are not eligible to win the event. The score will, however, count towards the three qualifying rounds required for future eligibility.
7. Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.
8. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
9. Men should inform Golf Operations if they are unable to participate in the Seligman Cup or Alfred Craven Memorial Trophy (top 16 net scores qualifying from day two of the Spring Meeting and top 32 net scores from day two of the Autumn Meeting respectively) before the subsequent match play draw is made for these competitions. *(i.e. if they are going to be away for more than three consecutive weeks, as this will adversely affect arranging match dates).*
10. It is every player's responsibility to play off their correct handicap. Playing off an incorrect handicap could result in disqualification.
11. Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No caddies allowed.
12. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
13. The **Hedges Butler Shield** will be jointly awarded to the winner of the stableford competition on day one of the Spring Meeting, and the stableford competition on day one of the Autumn Meeting.
14. The **Spring Meeting Medal** will be awarded to the winner of the handicap stroke play on day two of the Spring Meeting, and the **Autumn Medal** will be awarded to the winner of the handicap stoke play on day two of the Autumn Meeting.
15. The **Hele Shaw Trophy** will be awarded to the lowest gross score on Day Two of the Spring Meeting, and the **Scratch Gold Medal** will be awarded to the lowest gross score on Day Two of the Autumn Meeting.
16. The 18-hole **Coronation Challenge Putting Competition** is played on day one of the Spring meeting. You must play in the stableford competition to be able to enter this.



17. **The Dotteridge Memorial Trophy** will be awarded to the lowest combined net score of day two of the Spring Meeting and day two of the Autumn Meeting.
18. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best gross / net / stableford score (as appropriate for the trophy concerned) over the back 9 holes, then back 6, back 3, and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared. In the event of a tie in the **Dotteridge Memorial Trophy** the winner will be determined by the best net score on day two of the Autumn Meeting, then over the back 9 holes, back 6, back 3, and finally the 18th hole of the Autumn Meeting round. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
19. A player can win both the Gross and a Net prize
20. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null, and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: will be awarded.



SILVER JUBILEE CUP

FORMAT: An 18-hole handicap stroke play competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 18.4
2. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
3. The competition will be played on the Old Course from the white tees.
4. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95per cent of their **Course Handicap**.
- 5 All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Passholders who do not qualify using the above criteria, may still play in the events but they will not be charged the applicable entry fee and are not eligible to win the event. The score will, however, count towards the three qualifying rounds required for future eligibility.
- 6 Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.
- 7 Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
- 8 It is every player's responsibility to play off their correct handicap. Playing off an incorrect handicap could result in disqualification.
- 9 Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No caddies allowed.
- 10 Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
- 11 In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best net score over the back 9 holes, then back 6, back 3, and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
- 12 If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null, and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: will be awarded.



PHILLIPS CUP AND WOODCOTE SALVER

FORMAT: Both are 18-hole handicap stroke play competitions.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. The Phillips Cup is open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 13.4, and the Woodcote Salver is open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index from 13.5 - 18.4 inclusive.
2. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
3. The competition will be played on the Old Course from the white tees.
4. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95per cent of their **Course Handicap.**
5. All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Passholders who do not qualify using the above criteria, may still play in the events but they will not be charged the applicable entry fee and are not eligible to win the event. The score will, however, count towards the three qualifying rounds required for future eligibility.
6. Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
8. It is every player's responsibility to play off their correct handicap. Playing off an incorrect handicap could result in disqualification.
9. Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No caddies allowed.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II TROPHY AND HAMSHER CUP

FORMAT: Both are 18-hole handicap stroke play competitions.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 18.4
2. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
3. Each competition will be played on the Coronation Course from the white tees.
4. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95 per cent of their **Course Handicap**.
5. All pass holders must have three club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Passholders who do not qualify using the above criteria, may still play in the events but they will not be charged the applicable entry fee and are not eligible to win the event. The score will, however, count towards the three qualifying rounds required for future eligibility.
6. Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.

HAIG CUP

FORMAT: An 18-hole handicap stableford competition.

1. Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index of 18.5 and above.
2. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
3. The competition will be played on the Coronation Course from the white tees.
4. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95 per cent of their **Course Handicap**.
5. All pass holders must have three club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Passholders who do not qualify using the above criteria, may still play in the events but they will not be charged the applicable entry fee and are not eligible to win the event. The score will, however, count towards the three qualifying rounds required for future eligibility.
6. Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.

CAPTAIN'S PRIZE AND DAWN PATROL

FORMAT: Both are 18-hole handicap stableford competitions.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. The Captain's Prize is open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 18.4, and the Dawn Patrol is open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 24.4.
2. Each is a Shotgun start played on the Old Course from the white tees.
3. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95per cent of their **Course Handicap**.
4. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
5. All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Passholders who do not qualify using the above criteria, may still play in the events but they will not be charged the applicable entry fee and are not eligible to win the event. The score will, however, count towards the three qualifying rounds required for future eligibility.
6. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
7. Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.

SELIGMEN CUP AND ALFRED CRAVEN MEMORIAL TROPHY

FORMAT: Both are 18-hole singles handicap knockout competitions.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. The top 16 net places on day 2 of the Spring Meeting qualify for the Seligman Cup, and the top 32 net places on day 2 of the Autumn Medal qualify for the Alfred Craven Memorial Trophy.
2. The Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
3. Matches can be played on either course from the white plates.
4. Handicap allowance for matches: 100per cent of the difference between the **Course Handicap** of each player
5. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
6. Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No Caddies allowed.
7. Following the knockout draw, the responsibility for contact and arranging a match rests with both players. Members are expected to act with consideration when setting up matches and a choice of both weekday and weekend dates should be offered. Matches must be played by the round deadline date. The round deadline dates can only be extended in exceptional circumstances and only with the approval of the Golf Operations Committee. If a match remains unresolved once the round deadline date has passed, and no request for an extension has been received by the Golf Operations Committee, then both players are automatically disqualified. If mutually agreed, a coin toss may be used to determine who goes through to the next round.
8. Matches should not be played if there are more than 6 temporary greens unless mutually agreed by both sides.
9. It is every player's responsibility to play off their correct handicap. Playing off an incorrect could result in disqualification.
10. The winner is responsible for entering his name into the next round on the draw sheet and on Intelligent Golf.
11. If players disagree on the course to be played, a member of the Golf Operations office or Committee member should toss a coin and "Heads" will be for the Old Course and "Tails" will be for the Coronation course.

PRIZES: will be awarded.



ANGORA CUP, TIGER CUP & VETERANS CUP

FORMAT: Each is an 18-hole singles handicap knockout competition

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Tiger Cup: Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 18.4.

Angora Cup: Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index of 18.5 and above.

Veterans Cup: Open to male golf pass holders aged 60 years and above on the closing date of entry. There is no handicap restriction.

2. Handicap allowance for matches: 100per cent of the difference between the **Course Handicap** of each player
3. The Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. Tiger Cup matches are to be played from the **Tiger tees** on the Old Course or the **White Plates** on the Coronation Course. The Semi-Finals and Final are to be played on the Old Course. The final to be played on one day over 36 holes.

Angora Cup matches are to be played from the **Yellow tees** on either course up to the Quarter Finals. The Semi-Finals and Final are to be played on the Old Course from the **White tees**.

Veterans Cup matches are to be played from the **Yellow tees** on either course up to the Quarter Finals. The Semi-Finals and Final are to be played on the Old Course.

5. Men should not enter if they are away for more than three consecutive weeks during the period of the competition.
6. All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
8. Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No caddies allowed.
9. Following the knockout draw, the responsibility for contact and arranging a match rests with both players. Members are expected to act with consideration when setting up matches and a choice of both weekday and weekend dates should be offered. Matches must be played by the round deadline date. The round deadline dates can only be extended in exceptional circumstances and only with the approval of the Golf Operations Committee. If a match remains unresolved once the round deadline date has passed, and no request for an extension has been received by the Golf Operations Committee, then both players are automatically disqualified. If mutually agreed, a coin toss may be used to determine who goes through to the next round.

BETTERBALL KNOCKOUT COMPETITION

FORMAT: An 18-hole betterball handicap knockout pairs competition

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to male golf pass holders. There is no handicap restriction.
2. The Entry Fee (£6.00 per person) will be charged to members accounts Enter as a pair. Please let the Golf Operations office know if you require a partner.
3. Handicap allowances in matches: Handicap Index to **Course Handicap** then 90per cent to determine a playing handicap. Then it is the full difference between the playing handicaps taken off the lowest handicapper.
4. To be played from the White tees on either course. The Semi-Finals and Final are to be played on the Old Course.
5. Men should not enter if they are away for more than three consecutive weeks during the period of the competition.
6. All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
8. Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No caddies allowed.
9. Following the knockout draw, the responsibility for contact and arranging a match rests with both players. Members are expected to act with consideration when setting up matches and a choice of both weekday and weekend dates should be offered. Matches must be played by the round deadline date. The round deadline dates can only be extended in exceptional circumstances and only with the approval of the Golf Operations Committee. 12. The winner is responsible for entering his name into the next round on the draw sheet and on Intelligent Golf.
13. If players disagree on the course to be played, a member of the Golf Operations office or Committee member should toss a coin and "Heads" will be for the Old Course and "Tails" will be for the Coronation course.

PRIZES: will be awarded.



ELEY 4 BALL

FORMAT: An 18-hole Better ball handicap pairs competition played against bogey (par)

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 18.4.
2. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£10.00) will be charged to members accounts Enter as a pair. Please let the Golf Operations office know if you require a partner.
3. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 90 per cent of their **Course Handicap**.
4. To be played on the Old course from the White tees.
5. All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
6. Men must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
8. It is every player's responsibility to play off their correct handicap. Playing off an incorrect handicap could result in disqualification.
9. Buggies may only be used on the course on the production of a valid medical certificate. No caddies allowed.
10. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the players and the markers. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
11. The card must be scored as match play with a win (+) loss (-) or half (0) in the appropriate column **AND** the counting score must be recorded in the correct player column at a hole. The gross score must be recorded for a hole and NOT the net score.
12. Shots are taken at holes as indicated by the Stroke Index.
Play each hole against your own individual net par.
If you or *your partner* beat net par then mark the card with the best score and a (+)
If you or *your partner* equal net par- mark the card with the best score and a (0)
If you or *your partner cannot achieve a net par* mark the card with a (-) **and pick up your ball.**

Results: This is calculated by deducting the number of holes won (+) from the number of holes lost (-), (halved holes are not taken into account).
13. In the event of a tie the winners will be determined by the best 'bogey' score over the back 9 holes, then back 6, back 3, and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
14. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null, and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: will be awarded.



BENNETT FOURSOMES

FORMAT: A Foursomes competition played against bogey (par). The top 16 pairs in this competition qualify for the Winter Foursomes Knockout.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to male golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 18.4.
 2. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition and the Entry Fee (£10.00) will be charged to members accounts Enter as a pair. Please let the Golf Operations office know if you require a partner.

 5. All pass holders must have 3 club competitions on their record to be eligible to play in honour board events or, if a new member that has transferred in from another club, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.

- Results: This is calculated by deducting the number of holes won (+) from the number of holes lost (-), (halved holes are not taken into account).

Members are expected to act with consideration when setting up matches and a choice of both weekday and weekend dates should be offered. Matches must be played by the round deadline date.
