News From the Course

Over the past few weeks, the team has been busy on two main fronts. We have continued our fairway, approach and tee overseeding programme. Once completed, we would have drilled just under five tons of seed into these areas across both golf courses.

Alongside the overseeding work the team has also been focusing on course presentation. On the Coronation Course we have switched from using ride-on triple mowers to mow approaches as pictured below on the left. On the Old Course we have been hand-cutting tees as pictured below on the right. This not only improves presentation but also gives heavily trafficked areas a rest from the weight of our larger ride-on machinery. The team have also been busy checking bunker sand levels and adjusting where necessary.



This week we have started to see the first seedlings emerging from the areas overseeded a few weeks ago, pictured below on the left. Recent rainfall has been well-received and will help other areas establish more quickly. To help the existing grass on our fairways which suffered during this year's record-breaking summer, we have also applied a liquid fertiliser to the fairways and approaches on both courses pictured below on the right.
