News From the Course

As we begin the transition into autumn, our team has been hard at work ensuring the courses remain in excellent condition for the months ahead. Below is an update on recent projects and upcoming maintenance.



Overseeding Programme

After the hottest summer on record, combined with a very high volume of play, we have begun our overseeding programme. All approaches, tees and fairways will be overseeded in two directions to repair areas that struggled during this summer's conditions.



Pathway Upgrades - Coronation Course

In August, the installation of all new resin pathways on the Coronation Course was completed. The team is now working on remedial tasks around pathway edges, which will be seeded, with some entrances and exits turfed for a cleaner finish. Some gentle mounds will also be created in certain areas to hide pathways and create natural breaks between pathways. This week we will also begin installing anti-slip 'Grip Clad' surfaces on sleeper edges near tees and greens to improve safety.



Over the past few years additional irrigation heads have been installed across both courses to improve coverage in high-traffic areas. A long-standing challenge has been the walkway from the 12th tee on the Old Course to the fairway, situated between the 12th ladies' tee and the 16th green. During August's maintenance closure, irrigation heads were added to this area as shown above. This now allows us to water and fertilise the area more effectively, ensuring it remains in strong condition.



We are proud to share that two members of our team recently gained valuable experience at major golf events. Deputy Course Manager Gary Stewart (pictured above left) supported the greenkeeping team at East Lake for the Tour Championship while Senior Greenkeeper Jack Percival (pictured above right) worked with the team at The Belfry during the British Masters. Both clubs were highly complimentary of their contributions, whilst being able to bring back new ideas and best practices to benefit the Club and team.

Looking Ahead – Autumn Meetings

Alongside the above projects our focus is now firmly on preparations for the upcoming Autumn Meetings. The team is committed to ensuring both courses are presented in the best possible condition for our final major competition of the year.




Past Captains' Trophy

Sunday 14 September


The lunch following the competition will now take place in the 19th Hole following golf at approximately 1.45pm, not in the Derby Room as previously communicated.
