



LADIES' CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

FORMAT: S 36-hole stroke play competition played over two days.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 26.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
3. The Club Championship trophy will be awarded to the lowest 36-hole gross score. A prize will be awarded to the lowest 36-hole nett score. One prize is awarded per participant, with the Gross prizes taking priority. I.e. The Gross winner cannot win both the gross and the nett.
4. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£12.00) will be charged to members accounts.
5. First day to be played on the Coronation Course and second day on the Old Course and red tees.
6. Day one will be played in ascending handicap index order with the lowest handicap index going out first. Only the top 18 gross scores and ties will proceed to day two.
7. Day two will be played in descending gross score order with the lowest gross score going out last.
8. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
9. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate fee at the weekend.
10. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
11. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
12. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
13. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
14. In the event of a tie after day two then the Club Championship will be decided by a sudden death play-off 1st hole will be played three times. Followed by 2nd hole three times. Buggies with a driver will be allowed for the play-off without the production of a medical certificate. Drivers must not accompany players onto the greens at any point.
15. In the event of a tie for the nett prize the winner will be determined by the best nett score on day two, then over the back nine holes, back six, back three, and finally the 18th hole of day two. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
16. If play is suspended due to bad weather on either the Saturday or the Sunday (i.e. one day only) and cannot be resumed, then the results from the day that has been completed will decide the winner. If play is suspended on both days of the competition (i.e. both Saturday and Sunday), then the competition will be declared null and void. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: This will be presented on the second day following the completion of the competition.



LADIES' SENIORS' CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

FORMAT: An 18-hole handicap stroke play competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders aged 60 years and above on the day of the competition and with a handicap index up to 36.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
3. The Seniors Club Championship will be awarded to the Lady with the best nett score.
4. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
5. The competition will be played on the Old Course from the red tees.
6. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
7. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
8. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
9. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
10. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
11. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
12. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed, then the competition will be declared null and void. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: This will be presented on the second day of the main Club Championships following the completion of that competition.



LADIES' SPRING AND AUTUMN MEETINGS

FORMAT: Each meeting is played over two days as an alternate day; you can only play in one of the days. 18-hole stroke play competition.

RULES and CONDITION

1. These two Meetings incorporate the **Scratch Trophy, 36 Hole Challenge Cup**.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Ladies who haven't met the entry criteria can still play; however, will not be eligible to win the honours board.
3. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 36.0 at time of entry. Only Ladies up to 24.4 can win the Scratch Trophy. Ladies 24.5 to 36.0 are playing for the plate competition.
4. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£6.00 per day) will be charged to members accounts.
5. Spring Meeting will be played on the Old Course, and the Autumn Meeting will be played on the Coronation Course. Red tees.
6. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
7. Alternate day rules apply.
8. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
9. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
10. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
11. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
12. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
13. **The Scratch Trophy** will be jointly awarded to the winner of the Spring Meeting, and the winner of the Autumn Meeting up to 24.4 only.
14. **The 36 Hole Challenge Cup** will be awarded to the lowest combined nett score of the Spring Meeting and the Autumn Meeting.
15. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best gross score (as appropriate for the trophy concerned) over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared. In the event of a tie in the **36 Hole Challenge Cup** the winner will be determined by the best nett score out of either Spring or Autumn Meeting, then over the back nine holes, back six, back three. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
16. One prize is awarded per participant, with the Gross prizes taking priority. i.e. The Gross winner cannot win both the gross and the nett.



17. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.



LADIES' MAIDEN SALVER

FORMAT: Played over two days as an alternate day, you can only play in one of the days. 18-hole handicap stroke play competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 36.0 at time of entry. Ladies up to 24.4 can win the Maiden Salver. Ladies 24.5 to 36.0 are playing for the plate competition.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Ladies who haven't met the entry criteria can still play; however, will not be eligible to win the Honours board.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. The competition can be played on either course from the red tees.
5. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
6. Alternate day rules apply.
7. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
8. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
9. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
10. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
11. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
12. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best net score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
13. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.



LADIES' TIGER TROPHY

FORMAT: Played over two days as an alternate day, you can only play in one of the days. 18-hole handicap stroke play competition. Non qualifying competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 24.4 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Ladies who haven't met the entry criteria can still play; however, will not be eligible to win the Honours board.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. The competition is played from the White plates on the Coronation Course.
5. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
6. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Alternate day rules apply.
8. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
9. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
10. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
11. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
12. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best net score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
13. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.



THE MYRA MOONIE TROPHY

FORMAT: Played over two days as an alternate day, you can only play in one of the days. 18-hole handicap Stableford competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 54.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Ladies who haven't met the entry criteria can still play; however, will not be eligible to win the honours board.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition. The Entry Fee includes the meal and will be charged to members accounts.
4. The competition will be played on the Old Course from the Red tees.
5. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
6. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Alternate day rules apply.
8. Attending the Dinner is part of the entry requirement.
9. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
10. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
11. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
12. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
13. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best net score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
14. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: This will be presented at the Myra Moonie Dinner.



THE SILVER JUBILEE TROPHY

FORMAT: Played over two days as an alternate day, you can only play in one of the days. 18-hole handicap Stableford competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 54.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Ladies who haven't met the entry criteria can still play; however, will not be eligible to win the honours board.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition.
4. The competition will be played on the Coronation Course from the Red tees.
5. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
6. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Alternate day rules apply.
8. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
9. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
10. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
11. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
12. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best net score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
13. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.



LADIES' PAR TROPHY

FORMAT: Played over two days as an alternate day, you can only play in one of the days. 18 holes matchplay against the course. Non qualifying competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 36.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Ladies who haven't met the entry criteria can still play; however, will not be eligible to win the honours board.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**
5. The competition can be played on either Course from the Red tees.
6. Alternate day rules apply.
7. Cards to be marked with a gross score and with a plus or minus or half.
8. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
9. Players must collect a **scorecard** from Golf Reception.
10. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
11. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
12. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
13. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best net score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
14. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.



LADIES' SINGLES KNOCKOUT

FORMAT: 18-hole singles handicap knockout competitions.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 54.0 at time of entry. Two separate competitions, depending on number of entries. 0-24.4 and 24.5-54.0.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
3. The Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. Ladies should not enter if they are away for more than three consecutive weeks during the period of the competition, or if a regular absence will significantly restrict the available dates.
5. Matches can be played on either course from the red plates. Semi-Final and Final to be played on the Old Course.
6. Handicap allowance for matches: 100% of the difference between the **Course Handicap** of each player.
Use QR code to work out shot allowance.
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
8. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
9. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
10. Following the knockout draw, the responsibility for contact and arranging a match rests with the top players in the first instance. Within five days of the start date of the round, the top players must contact his opponent and offer at least four dates, including two weekend dates (on different weekends).
11. Should the top player fail to contact his opponent and offer dates within the aforementioned five days, then the bottom player assumes the right to choose the course and must contact his opponent and offer at least four dates, including weekend dates (on different weekends).
12. Members are expected to act with consideration when setting up matches. Members are to act with the full intention of playing their fixture and therefore share the responsibility of organising matches in a timely manner. It is the expected etiquette of a Club Member to respectfully concede their match, should they not be able to offer dates in relation to the scheduling rules.
13. If a match date cannot be mutually agreed, the matter should be raised to the Golf Operations team, who will review each case individually to determine who will proceed. In situations where no clear outcome can be determined, a coin toss will be used.
14. Match extensions will be granted only in exceptionally circumstances, with respect for those in the competition. An extension may only be granted to a maximum of one week and should be requested through Golf Operations, stating the exceptional circumstance.
15. If a match remains unresolved once the round deadline date has passed, and no request for an extension has been received by Golf Operations, then both players are automatically disqualified.



16. Matches should not be played if there are more than 6 temporary greens unless mutually agreed by both sides.
17. The winner is responsible for entering her name into the next round.



LADIES' CORONATION BOWL

FORMAT: An 18-hole handicap stroke play competition. To be played on the first day of the Ladies Club Championship.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 26.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition. The Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. The Coronation Bowl will be awarded to the lowest 18-hole nett score on the first day of the Club Championship.
5. Matches must be played on the Coronation course from the red tees.
6. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
8. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
9. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
10. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best nett score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
11. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed, then the competition will be declared null and void. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: This will be presented on the second day following the completion of the Club Championship competition.



LADIES' 36 HOLE CHALLENGE CUP

FORMAT: Combined nett score from the Ladies Spring Meeting Medal & Ladies Autumn Meeting Medal.

RULES and CONDITIONS

In the event of a tie in the **36 Hole Challenge Cup** the winner will be determined by the best nett score out of the Spring or Autumn Meeting, then over the back nine holes, back six, back three and finally the 18th hole of the Autumn Meeting round. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.



PAST LADY CAPTAINS' PLATE

FORMAT: an 18-hole handicap Stableford qualifying competition

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to all Past Captains, irrespective of whether they are current golf pass holders, or members of the Royal Automobile Club.
2. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
3. To be played on the Old Course from the Red tees.
4. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
5. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
6. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
7. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
8. In the event of a tie the winners will be determined by the best Stableford score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
9. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: The Plate will be presented to the winner at the lunch.



LADIES' WINTER FOURSOMES KNOCKOUT

FORMAT: an 18-hole foursomes knockout competition

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap Index up to 54.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions (i.e. Medals/Stablefords) at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if in the case of a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
3. The Entry Fee (£6.00 per person) will be charged to members accounts.
4. Handicap allowances in matches: a pair will receive 50% of the difference between their combined **Course Handicap** and then full difference. Use QR code to work out shot allowance.
5. Players should not enter if they are away for more than three consecutive weeks during the period of the competition, or if a regular absence will significantly restrict the available dates.
6. Any amendment to playing partners should be done before a pair playing their first match.
7. To be played on either course from the red plates. Semi Final and Final to be played on the Old Course.
8. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
9. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
10. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
11. Following the knockout draw, the responsibility for contact and arranging a match rest with the top players in the first instance. Within five days of the start date of the round, the top players must contact his opponent and offer at least four dates, including two weekend dates (on different weekends).
12. Should the top players fail to contact her opponent and offer dates within the aforementioned five days, then the bottom player assumes the right to choose the course and must contact his opponent and offer at least four dates, including two weekend dates (on different weekends).
13. Members are expected to act with consideration when setting up matches. Members are to act with the full intention of playing their fixture and therefore share the responsibility of organising matches in a timely manner. It is the expected etiquette of a Club Member to respectfully concede their match, should they not be able to offer dates in relation to the scheduling rules.
14. If a match date cannot be mutually agreed, the matter should be raised to the Golf Operations team, who will review each case individually to determine who will proceed. In situations where no clear outcome can be determined, a coin toss will be used.
15. Match extensions will be granted only in exceptionally circumstances, with respect for those in the competition. An extension may only be granted to a maximum of one week and should be requested through Golf Operations, stating the exceptional circumstance.
16. If a match remains unresolved once the round deadline date has passed, and no request for an extension has been received by Golf Operations, then both players are automatically disqualified.



17. Matches should not be played if there are more than six temporary greens unless mutually agreed by both sides.
18. The winners are responsible for entering their names into the next round.



ORDER OF MERIT HONOURS BOARD COMPETITION

FORMAT: Honours board and the anniversary bowl competitions will qualify for the Order of Merit.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. The Order of Merit is open to all Lady golf pass holders.
2. There is no entry fee for this competition.
3. The following competitions are included in the Order of Merit.
 - Anniversary Bowl (Non honours board)
 - Spring Meeting
 - Maiden Salver
 - Myra Moonie
 - Par Trophy (Non-qualifying competition)
 - Club Championship
 - Tiger Trophy (Non-qualifying competition)
 - Kitten Cup (Non-qualifying competition)
 - Autumn Meeting
 - Silver Jubilee Trophy
4. For a competition to be valid for the Order of Merit there must be a minimum entry of 20 players per competition.
5. Points will be awarded to the top 15 players in each qualifying competition (15 points for 1st overall place: one point for 15th overall place).
6. A player's best five results will count towards the Order of Merit.



LADIES' COMPETITION BOWL

FORMAT: Played over two days as an alternate day, you can only play in one of the days. Only winners of 18-hole qualifying competitions prior to the date of the previous year's competition can take part.

18-hole handicap stroke play competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index.
2. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
3. The competition can be played on either course from the red tees.
4. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
5. Alternate day rules apply.
6. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
8. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
9. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
10. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
11. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best nett score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
12. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.



MIXED FOURSOMES TROPHY

FORMAT: 18-hole Mixed Foursomes Stableford.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Men and Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 36.0 at time of entry. Single players are welcome to enter, with the aim of being paired up with another pass holder.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions Medals/Stablefords at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£7.00 each) will be charged to members accounts.
4. To be played on either course. Men play from the White tees. Ladies play from the Red tees. Use men's index throughout.
5. Handicap allowance: 50% of their combined **Course Handicap**.
6. Players must collect their **OWN** scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
8. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
9. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
10. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
11. In the event of a tie the winners will be determined by the best score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
12. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.



MIXED KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

FORMAT: 18-hole Better Ball mixed pairs matchplay played over 18 holes.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Amateur Men and Amateur Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index up to 28.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least 3 qualifying competitions Medals/Stablefords at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record.
3. The Entry Fee (£7.00 each) will be charged to members accounts.
4. Players should not enter if they are away for more than three consecutive weeks during the period of the competition, or if a regular absence will significantly restrict the available dates.
5. Handicap allowances in matches: Handicap Index, Course Handicap, (CR-Par) added to the Ladies handicap for shot adjustment. 90% is applied to the difference between the players course handicaps, taken from the lowest player upwards. Use QR code to workout shot allowance.
Individual players score using the Card and Stroke Index appropriate for the tee they are playing from.
6. To be played on either course. Men from the White plates. Ladies from the Red plates. Semi Final and Final to be played on the Old Course.
7. Any amendment to playing partners should be done before a pair playing their first match.
8. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
9. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
10. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
11. Following the knockout draw, the responsibility for contact and arranging a match rest with the top players in the first instance. Within five days of the start date of the round, the top players must contact his opponent and offer at least four dates, including two weekend dates (on different weekends).
12. Should the top players fail to contact his opponent and offer dates within the aforementioned five days, then the bottom player assumes the right to choose the course and must contact his opponent and offer at least 4 dates, including two weekend dates (on different weekends).
13. Members are expected to act with consideration when setting up matches. Members are to act with the full intention of playing their fixture and therefore share the responsibility of organising matches in a timely manner. It is the expected etiquette of a Club Member to respectfully concede their match, should they not be able to offer dates in relation to the scheduling rules.
14. If a match date cannot be mutually agreed, the matter should be raised to the Golf Operations team, who will review each case individually to determine who will proceed. In situations where no clear outcome can be determined, a coin toss will be used.



15. Match extensions will be granted only in exceptionally circumstances, with respect for those in the competition. An extension may only be granted to a maximum of one week and should be requested through Golf Operations, stating the exceptional circumstance.
16. If a match remains unresolved once the round deadline date has passed, and no request for an extension has been received by Golf Operations, then both players are automatically disqualified.
17. Matches should not be played if there are more than 6 temporary greens unless mutually agreed by both sides.
18. The winners are responsible for entering their names into the next round on the draw sheet and on Intelligent Golf.



LADIES' KITTEN CUP

FORMAT: Played over two days as an alternate day, you can only play in one of the days. 18-hole handicap non-qualifying Stableford competition.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Lady golf pass holders with a handicap index from 24.5 to 54.0 at time of entry.
2. Pass holders must have played in at least three qualifying competitions Medals/Stablefords at the Royal Automobile Club 364 days prior to the date of the competition or, if a pass holder that has transferred in from another club within the last six months, they must have a full complement of 20 scores on their WHS Handicap Index record. Players who have not met the entry requirement can still play, however, can't win the honours board.
3. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£6.00) will be charged to members accounts.
4. The competition will be played from either Course. Yellow tees, using red stroke index.
5. Handicap allowance: a player will receive 95% of their **Course Handicap**.
6. Players must collect a scorecard from Golf Reception.
7. Alternate day rules apply.
8. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
9. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
10. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
11. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
12. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
13. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.



THE COMPENDIUM CUP (Non-Honours board)

FORMAT: 18-hole mixed pairs Stableford competition played over 18 holes in two formats- A mixture Foursomes and Greensomes format played on the Coronation Course.

RULES and CONDITIONS

1. Open to Men and Lady golf pass holders with a handicap Index up to 54.0 at time of entry. Single players are welcome to enter, with the aim to be paired with another golf pass holder.
2. Entries will open four weeks prior to the date of the competition, and the Entry Fee (£6.00 each) will be charged to members accounts.
3. Handicap allowance: 50% of combined course handicap throughout.
4. To be played on Coronation course. Men from the White tees. Ladies from the red tees. Using Men's Stroke index.
5. Mid-week pass holders are required to pay the appropriate green fee at weekends.
6. Buggies may only be used in accordance with Club policy.
7. Caddies under 18 years of age are allowed subject to the Club's Safeguarding policy.
8. It is every player's responsibility to play off their correct handicap. Playing off an incorrect handicap could result in disqualification.
9. Cards must be agreed and signed by both the player and the marker. Failure by either of these could result in disqualification.
10. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the best score over the back nine holes, then back six, back three and finally the 18th hole. If scores remain tied, then the trophy will be equally shared.
11. If play is suspended due to bad weather and cannot be resumed on the same day, then the competition will be declared null and void and all scores will be cancelled. Where possible, a new date will be set by the committee for the competition to be played.

PRIZES: This will be presented following the competition in the 19th hole.



NINE-HOLE STABLEFORD COMPETITION

A nine-hole Stableford competition will be run on the Tuesday alongside the following handicap limited competitions:

- Spring Meeting
- Maiden Salver
- Par Trophy
- Autumn Meeting

The nine-hole Stableford will be open to passholders who meet the following criteria:

1. Are returning from injury.
2. Find 18 holes difficult to complete.
3. Are seeking to put in their handicap cards.
4. Do not meet the three qualifying card criteria for the main competition.
5. Have played in the weekend alternate day of the above-mentioned competitions.
