A BRIEF HISTORY OF GIN

Gin, a spirit which derives its predominant flavour from juniper berries, has evolved over the course of hundreds of years from a herbal medicine to one of the most popular spirits amongst our members.

From the early 17th century troops fighting in the low countries during the Thirty Years' War looked to gin for Dutch courage during long campaigns, and to keep them warm in the damp and difficult conditions. Many of the troops brought gin back into England. In the 1660s the famous diarist Samuel Pepys wrote of "strong water made with juniper" that was used as a treatment for colic; although whether this was for his own ailment or for infants remains unclear.

When King William III, better known as William of Orange, came to the English throne in 1689, he actively encouraged the distillation of English spirits. The distillation process took place on a small scale, and though the quality was below average, it fast became a popular tippie of the working classes. On the odd occasion, gin was distributed to workers as part of their wages and soon the volume sold daily exceeded that of beer and ale, which was more expensive.

The 18th century saw laws passed and gin being taxed and made available for sale only in public houses. Gin was transformed from a beverage of escapism for the working class to one of moderation for the middle class.

During the 19th century, the quality of gin progressed into a new league. Prior to this, gin bore no resemblance to the gins of today; it was a thick, sweet, full, rich drink with heavy juniper notes. With improvements in both the understanding and quality of distillation of gin there was no longer a need for sugar and glycerine to mask the rank spirit.

Gradually, it became drier, with delicate, complex flavours, introduced courtesy of a wide range of exotic botanicals; more like the drink we know today.

It became known as 'London Dry Gin' simply because most distillers were based in the capital. There has never been a requirement to be geographically connected to London; the term then referred to a style, which later became a defined production method.

Today, gin is one of the most popular and widely distributed range of spirits and is represented by products of various origins, styles and flavours that all revolve around juniper as a common ingredient. Typically, a fine gin contains between six and ten botanicals.

Pinkster Gin (37.5%)	£15.40
The original pink gin made with real raspberries that has been titillating taste buds since 2013.	
Tanqueray Export (43.1%)	£15.80
Tanqueray Export Strength is a quality London Dry Gin. It is beloved by bartenders for its rich, citrus-led palate.	
Jin Jiji (43%)	£16.20
This is a premium Indian gin that artfully captures the diverse botanicals of the sub-continent, distilled in Goa.	
Plymouth (41.2%)	£16.20
This is a distinctive style of gin made in Plymouth since 1793 using a blend of seven botanicals.	
Bombay Sapphire (40%)	£17.20
Sapphire launched the new gin era. Its fresh style is achieved via vapour infusion of the botanicals.	
Malfy Con Limone (40.8%)	£17.20
Amalfi Coast and Sicilian lemons are basket pressed then distilled with Tuscan juniper, cassia, coriander and licquorice for this citrus burst of Italian sunshine.

Engine Gin (42%) £17.60

Made by master distillers in the Alta Langa region of Northwestern Italy, Engine Gin is a handcrafted London Dry Gin.

White Cliffs Kent Dry Gin (43%) £17.70

A coastal-inspired Kent gin made by the Pleasant Land Distillery, using wild foraged juniper, samphire, orange blossom and elderflower.

Beefeater 24 (45%) £17.80

12 hand selected botanicals go into this iconic gin including coriander, Seville orange peel and green teas.

Aviation American Gin (42%) £17.80

Gin that is praised for its smoothness, spice and floral notes.

Opihr Oriental Spiced Gin (40%) £18.00

Discover the exotic - cubebs from Indonesia, black pepper from India and coriander from Morocco.

G'Vine (40%) £18.00

The base spirit is grape, which gives this French gin a delicate texture and floral aroma.

Edinburgh Gin (43%) £19.20

The finest Scottish grain is still traditionally distilled in a 200 year-old copper pot.

Brockmans Gin (40%) £19.30

Delicious gin from Brockmans. This is made with Bulgarian coriander, blueberries and blackberries as well as bittersweet Valencia orange peels. The result is well balanced and full of flavour.

Sipsmith London Dry (41.6%) £19.40

Distilled in Hammersmith using ten traditional London botanicals.

Gin Mare (42.7%) £19.40

Mediterranean gin with four botanicals: basil, thyme, rosemary and Arbequina olive.

Brighton Gin (40%) £20.00

Brighton Gin's botanicals remains a secret. The distillers have said that they use juniper, angelica, orange, lime and milk thistle.

Hendricks (41.4%) £20.10

An innovative, smooth gin made with cucumber and rose petals, it has a refreshing floral taste.

Warner Edwards Elderflower Gin (40%) £20.10

A beautifully balanced gin that is smooth, sweet and delicately fragranced with summer elderflower.

Warner Edwards Rhubarb Gin (40%) £20.40

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KI NO BI Dry Gin (45.7%) £20.40

Made in a recognisable dry style but with a distinct Japanese accent.

Martin Miller's (40%) £20.40

Gin made from the distillation of ten botanicals and cut with pure Icelandic water.

Greensand Ridge London Dry (40%) £20.40

From the Weald of Kent, this ethical producer is not only sustainable but oh so smooth, with gorse, honey and ground cob nuts in the recipe.

Cotswolds Gin (46%) £20.40

The first release from Cotswolds Distillery, a dry gin made from wheat spirit and nine botanicals. A fruity gin with a spicy backbone.

Mermaid Gin (41.6%) £20.60

From the Isle of Wight rock samphire and Boadicea hops alongside juniper, coriander seeds, fresh lemon zest, grains of paradise, angelica, liquorice, orris and elderflower.

Bathtub Gin (43.3%) £21.20

Very high quality copper pot still spirit infused with ingredients including juniper, orange peel, coriander, cassia, cloves and cardamom.

The Botanist (46%) £21.60

Uniquely augmented by 22 hand-foraged island botanicals, a rare explosion of flavour.

Roku Japanese Gin (43%) £21.60

The first gin from Japan's legendary Suntory distillery, using a selection including six Japanese native botanicals.

Silent Pool (43%) £21.90

The gin itself features 24 botanicals, including kaffir lime, chamomile, local honey and lavender, resulting in a subtly sweet balanced tipple.

Tanqueray Ten (47.3%) £22.00

An incredible small batch of London Dry Gin made in pot still number ten, citrusy and full-bodied.

Copper Rivet Dockyard Gin (41.2%) £22.40

From the fantastic Copper Rivet distillery in Chatham comes Dockyard Gin.

N°3 London Dry Gin (46%) £24.40

Traditional copper pot distilled with six botanicals from those classy chaps at Berry Bros and Rudd down at the end of Pall Mall.

Pink Pepper Gin (44%) £24.60

Made with hand-picked pink peppercorns and a handful of other tasty botanicals including honey, vanilla and cardamom, all of which are macerated separately then distilled under low pressure and temperature.

Saint George Terroir Gin (45%) £25.30

Its botanical selection of Douglas Fir, coastal sage and Californian bay laurel gives it a magical nose that makes you really feel like you are stood in a Californian forest.

Elephant Gin (46%) £26.40

There are 14 botanicals in the recipe, including African wormwood, baobab, devil's claw, apple, elderflower, ginger and pine needles.

Monkey 47 (47%) £28.60

A curious gin from the Black Forest in Germany. Made with 47 botanicals and bottled at 47%. Cranberries, a 'secret weapon typical to the Black Forest', are also added.

Beefeater Burroughs Reserve (43%) £35.60

Small batch gin from Beefeater's 'Still Number 12' (James Burrough's original copper still with a capacity of just 268 litres), aged in ex-Bordeaux wine oak casks, both white and red.
