

CORONATION COURSE LOCAL RULES

Internal Out of Bounds

During play of Hole 1, the left side (namely Hole 18 of the Old Course), defined by white stakes, is out of bounds. These stakes are boundary objects during the play of hole 1. For all other holes, they are movable obstructions.

During play of Hole 3, the left side (namely Hole 16 of the Old Course), defined by white stakes, is out of bounds. These stakes are boundary objects during the play of hole 3. For all other holes, they are movable obstructions.

During play of Hole 6, the left side (namely Hole 5), defined by white stakes, is out of bounds. These stakes are boundary objects during the play of hole 6. For all other holes, they are movable obstructions.

A ball coming to rest on or over the road to the right side of hole 9 shall be deemed out of bounds.

Relief from Aeration Holes

If a player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole on the putting green, relief may be taken under Rule 16.1.

Protection of Young Trees

Staked trees are abnormal course conditions. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1.

Ball Deflected by Post and Rope

If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit 'post and/or rope' protecting the greens from buggy and trolley traffic during play, the player **MUST** replay the stroke by playing the original ball or another ball from the spot where that stroke was made.

Abnormal Course Conditions

Ground under repair (GUR) is defined by any area encircled by a white line. Play is prohibited in areas identified as GUR.

Roads and Paths

All man-made roads and paths on the course are treated as immovable obstructions from which free relief is allowed under Rule 16.1. Exceptions include those identified as Out of Bounds when playing Hole 18.

Fixed Sprinkler Heads

All fixed sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions.

Penalty for Breach of Local Rules

Match Play – Loss of Hole
Stroke Play – Two Stroke Penalty
